1. Do you know where the deepest in the world subway station is?

The deepest in the world subway (metro) station is located in the Ukrainian capital, of Kiev! It is Arsenal'na metro station (red line) and its depth is 105 meters!

2. Do you know where the center of Europe is?

The center of Europe is in Ukraine! Geographic center of Europe is considered to be in a small Western Ukrainian town Rakhiv, surrounded by picturesque Carpathian Mountains.

3. Do you know which city has the shortest main street?

The shortest city main street, but at the same time one of the widest and the most spectacular is Khreshchatyk Street in the Ukrainian capital Kiev. Its total length is 1,225 meters.

4. Do you know which language takes the second place in the world on melodic criteria?

Ukrainian language took the second place on melodic criteria, after Italian. It was ranked as the third most beautiful language in the world on such criteria as phonetics, vocabulary, phraseology and sentence structure after French and Persian at a linguistic contest held in Paris in 1934.

5. Do you know who created the world's first constitution?

The world's first constitution was created by Ukrainian politician Pylyp Orlyk. On April 5th, 1710 he was elected the Hetman of Zaporizhia troops. On the same day Pylyp Orlyk announced "the Constitution of the rights and freedoms of the Zaporizhia army." The U.S. Constitution was adopted in 1787, and French and Polish constitutions in 1791.

6. Do you know who the most famous Ukrainians in Hollywood are?

The Holodomor, or Hunger plague, was a famine engineered by the Soviet Union, as part of a series of actions, including mass executions, designed to destroy the Ukrainian nation.

9. What was the genocide policy?

Confiscation of grain and all other foods in rural districts, including all edible things inside the homes.

10. What nation was the first to recognize Holodomor as Genocide?

Canada was the first nation to recognize Holodomor as Genocide, in part due to Ukrainian immigrants becoming active in political and educational aspects of their communities.
